- Lingfelder, “Bird Label” Riesling [Pfalz, Germany 2007]** 11/34
A lovely example of an off-dry wine with just a touch sweet and enough acidity so as not to be cloying. The wine features light notes of grass and petrol.
- Plaimont, “Colombelle” [Cotes de Gascogne, France 2007]** 6/19
Tropical fruit and peach on the nose. This wine has a lovely stony palate with a dry, tart finish.
- Domaine Barraud, Macon-Villages [Burgundy, France 2007]** 10/31
A classic Maconnais Chardonnay that is gold in color with flavor of light peach, apple fruit and a slight toastiness.
- Semeli, “Mountain Sun” [Peloponnese, Greece 2007]** 8/24
A blend of Moschofilero and Roditis, there are notes of white raisin, fig, quince and lemongrass all with a touch of tartness on the finish.
- Burgans, Albarino [Rias Baizas, Spain 2007]** 12/36
Green asparagus and honey on the nose with bright citrus fruit, minerality and brininess.
- Fontaleoni, Vernaccia di San Gimignano [Tuscany, Italy 2007]** 10/31
Subtle Asian pear on the nose. This lighter, dry white has notes of lemon and fresh cut grass and finishes with a hint of almond.
- El Coto, Rioja Blanco [Rioja, Spain 2007]** 8/24
100% Viura. This dry white has light citrus fruit and racy acidity offset by a pleasant floral, herbal finish.
- Marc Aurel, Grüner Veltliner [Austria 2007]** 8/25
A medium bodied, harmonious, accessible wine with a fresh grapefruit aroma, a touch of exotic fruit and hints of white pepper - which is typical for this grape.
- Mapuche, Sauvignon Blanc [Central Valley, Chile 2008]** 8/24
A very easy to appreciate wine with that distinctive Sauvignon Blanc grassiness combined with tropical fruit flavors and a clean mineral finish.
- Steele Shooting Star, Aligote [Washington State 2007]** 10/31
Aligote is Burgundy’s “other white grape”. Caramel and light herbs on the nose while delicate white fruit, almond and toast finish the wine.
- Del Rio, Pinot Gris [Rouge Valley, Oregon 2007]** 11/34
Wonderfully light apricot on the nose. Lush, round peach and fig fruit are balanced with a hint of spice and vanilla.

Laurent Miquel, Chardonnay/Viognier [Languedoc, France 2007] 7/22
A tasty blend from the South of France, this wine has light citrus and peachy fruit flavor accented by a touch of honey and flintiness.

Pierre Laplace, Madiran [Madiran, France 2005] 9/28
Tannat is the main grape in this dry red. Hints of cassis on the noses lead to a rich, tannic palate of stewed fruits. Slightly jammy, but finishes quite dry.

Thomas Henry, Zinfandel [Russian River Valley, California 2006] 8/26
This is a more restrained, balanced style of California Zinfandel. Juicy, wild cherry on the palate with a peppery, spicy finish.

Rock Point, "River Rock Red" Syrah/Cabernet Sauvignon [Oregon 2006] 7/22
The growers at Rock Point have provided grapes for some of Oregon's finest wines. Now, comes their own Cab/Syrah blend with pretty strawberry and raspberry flavors.

Higo, Grenache [Russian River Valley, California 2006] 10/31
Light cranberry on the nose, followed by a rich raisin fruit. Nicely balanced tannins and subtle vanilla notes follow on the long finish.

Fado, "Alentejano" [Alentejo, Portugal 2007] 7/22
The nose is floral with undertones of violet. A rich, concentrated wine with dark cherry fruit and a touch of leather. Nicely balanced by a bit of tannin.

Chateau de Caladroy, "Les Schistes" Roussillon [Rousillon, France 2005] 11/34
Grenache driven, but blended with the usual suspects (ask!). The low yield vines produce a concentrated, earthy wine with hints of leather and tobacco on top of black fruit. Brambly!

Cantaluna, Pinot Noir Reserva [Colchagua Valley, Chile 2006] 9/27
While still a fruity Pinot Noir, there is a nice bit of earthiness to this wine. It tastes of cherries with a light floral note on the nose.

Cascina Castelet, Barbera d'Asti [Piedmont, Italy 2007] 11/33
This organically farmed Barbera has pretty, fruity, floral aromas with bright red fruit and an undercurrent of warm spice.

Fausti, Rosso Picena "Fausto" [Marche, Italy 2006] 9/28
Violet, cherry notes on the nose. This wine has round supple tannins with

bright, dry fruit and a hint of toasted oak. A blend of Sangiovese and Montepulciano.

Heartland, Shiraz [South Australia 2006] 12/36

The nose has characteristic notes of cherry cola. On the palate sweet spice and a touch of eucalyptus and blackcurrant. Light tannins make this a very drinkable wine.

Weninger, Zweigelt [Mittelburgenland, Austria 2006] 10/31

Slightly earthy version of an Austrian favorite. Juicy fruit, non-aggressive tannins and subtle pomegranate flavors with just a touch of black pepper.

Roagna, Dolcetto d'Alba [Piedmonte, Italy] 13/39

Dolcetto d'Alba offers an explosion of dark red fruit, flowers, licorice and tar with lovely inner perfume and gorgeous balance.

Marquis Philips, "Holly's Blend" Verdelho [SE Australia 2007] 25

Grapefruit and citrus fruits. This Verdelho is smooth, light and juicy. There is a slight briny and fennel flavor.

Stadlmann, Zierfandler [Thermenregion, Austria 2007] 40

Thermenregion is just south of Vienna. Quince and nut on the nose. Mouth watering and juicy on the palate. Baked apple, citrus zest with a stony finish.

Pascal Jolivet, "Attitude" Sauvignon Blanc [Loire, France 2007] 45

Could it be you're smelling green pepper? Yes! This spicy Loire Sauvignon Blanc is backed with grapefruit and mineral flavors.

Hopler, Pinot Blanc [Burgenland, Austria 2007] 40

This biodynamic wine has dominant stone fruit flavor and light citrus. It is bright and lovely with balanced acidity.

Domaine Pautre, Petit Chablis [Chablis, France 2007] 50

Like all of Chablis, this Chardonnay sees no oak, so the beautiful citrus and green apple characteristics shine through. 40 year old vines and calciferous soils give this wine a flinty finish.

Stefano Massone, "Masera" Gavi [Piedmont, Italy 2007] 35

Made from 100% Cortese grapes. This straw-yellow colored wine has notes of apple and pear. There is a slight stoniness on the long refreshing finish.

Renacer, "Punto Final" Malbec [Mendoza, Argentina 2006] 42

Deep red in color with intense violet shades. On the nose, a combination of red fruits and toasty notes from the French oak on the palate. In the mouth the wine is complex and structured with a long finish.

- David Bruce, Petite Sirah [Central Coast, California 2006] 45**
 Ripe, dense Petite Sirah fruit gives this wine a gamey, meaty nose. This wine has rich, dark fruits and a long, dry finish. Perfect with our cured meats.
- Chateau Smith, Cabernet Sauvignon [Columbia Valley, Washington 2006] 55**
 Slight cassis, anise and blueberry on the nose. There is a bit of tobacco leaf mixed with bright red currant fruit. Lovely!
- Hewitson, “Miss Harry” GSM [Barossa Valley, Australia 2005] 50**
 Another big, jammy wine from Australia! Spice cake and ripe, round fruit are balanced by light acidity and tannins.
- Joel Gott, Syrah [California 2005] 50**
 Deep ruby red and purple in color, this Syrah has violet, blueberry and sweet spice on the nose. On the palate raspberry and plum fruit is balanced by easy tannins.
- Domaine Bouley, Volnay [Cote d’Or, France 2006] 80**
 Complex, yet expressive and fresh. The grapes for this Volnay come from a combination of low yield old vines and younger vines planted just 15 years ago. Drinking wonderfully now!

- St Michel-Eppan, Pinot Grigio [Alto Adige, Italy 2007] 18**
 Dry, and smooth with a long finish, this Pinot Grigio has an aroma like fresh cut pear. An excellent balance of acidity gives this wine strength and structure.
- Hugel, “Cuvee les Amours” Pinot Blanc [Alsace, France 2006] 19**
 Beautiful, light, and dry. This delicate Pinot Blanc is refreshing enough as an aperitif, but also pairs nicely with spicy food. This is Alsace at its best.
- Domaine de Chatenoy, Menetou-Salon [Loire, France 2006] 19**
 Sauvignon Blanc from Loire. Aromas of white peach and flowers gives way to flavors of apricot, red grapefruit and mineral.
- Claiborne & Churchill, Riesling [Central Coast, California 2006] 21**
 From Monterey County, this dry Riesling has aromas of honeysuckle and rich, viscous peach flavors. An outstanding wine from one of America’s best Riesling producers.
- La Rivolta, Falanghina [Campagna, Italy 2007] 22**
 Fermented in stainless steel, this 100% Falanghina has notes of banana, apple and sage. It finishes with bright, clean minerals.
- Landmark, “Overlook” Chardonnay [Sonoma Valley, California 2007] 28**
 Ageing in French oak for nine months gives aromas of toasted almonds, caramel,

and coconut. On the palate there is green apple, lemon rind and clean acidity.

JJ Vincent, “Marie Antoinette” Pouilly-Fuisse [Burgundy, France 2006] 28

Stony soils give this Chardonnay acidity and minerality. Round melon and honey flavors are accented by a hint of oak. A great value from Burgundy.

Merry Edwards, Sauvignon Blanc [Russian River Valley, California 2007] 40

Citrus fruit, lychee, mango and soft honey as well. This Sauvignon Blanc is barrel fermented in mostly neutral oak to add weight and mouthfeel.

Olivier Leflaive, Meursault [Cote d’Or, France 2005] 47

A beautiful example of Burgundian Chardonnay, this wine has clean peach and pear fruit that finishes with apricot and spicy oak notes.

Cafaro, Merlot [Napa Valley, California 2003] 25

This wine is from 100% estate grown fruit just south of Stags Leap. The juice is ripe but not overpowering, with just a touch of oak and cedar on the finish.

Paul Jaboulet Aine, Crozes-Hermitage [Northern Rhone, France 2005] 27

A wine made from 100% Syrah. Pure, penetrating fruit with hints of black raspberry, cherry and earth. Just a touch of oak on the smooth finish.

Foradori, Teroldego [Trentino, Italy 2006] 28

Another biodynamic wine! Teroldego is Syrah-like in flavor. Full bodied and gamey, this wine has toasty notes from ageing in small casks.

Ridge, Lytton Springs [Sonoma, California 2006] 36

Mostly Zinfandel in this blend from one of California’s greatest producers. Rich, ripe fruit and subtle tannin add to the complexity of this wine.

August Briggs, Pinot Noir “Dijon Clones” [Napa Valley, California 2005] 38

This Pinot Noir has a ruby color with rose petal aromas leading into dark, silky fruit. It

finishes with a touch of earth and smokiness.

Sineann, Old Vine Zinfandel [Columbia Valley, Oregon 2007] 40

Dark fruits, blackberry, cinnamon and a hint of cedar blend nicely with underlying leather and tar notes.

Domaine Bois de Boursan, Chateauneuf-du-Pape [Rhone, France 2006] 50

“With rich, attractive, earthy notes, and plenty of floral and spice box characteristics interwoven with dark, ripe red and black fruits, lavender, and oodles of Provencal typicity, it is full-bodied, fleshy, and already gorgeous to drink” –Robert Parker

Copain, ‘Harrison Clarke’ Syrah [Santa Ynez Valley, California 2005] 55

Vibrant purple in color, full bodied with lots of big, dark berry fruit that works nicely with subtle notes of black pepper and olive.

Canalicchio di Sopra, Brunello di Montalcino [Tuscany, Italy 2003] 60

Deep red in color, this wine has flavors of crushed dried fruits, flowers and incense. A lush wine with sturdy tannic structure. Very special!

Roagna, ‘Pajé’ Barbaresco [Piedemonte, Italy 2000] 60

Sweet, long and round, it reveals attractive layers of smoke, tar, cocoa, black cherries, cedar and tobacco in a big, full-bodied style.

Mugneret, Vosne-Romanee [Cote de Nuits, France 2006] 65

Expressive Pinot Noir from a cult producer. Floral and aromatic with concentrated raspberry, black cherry and lilac. A true joy to experience.

Naveran, ‘Dama’ Cava [Penedes, Spain 2006] 9/27

Light and fruity on the nose, full and dry on the palate with a delicate fruity aftertaste that finishes with a nice bit of mousse.

Besserat de Bellefon, ‘Cuvee des Moines’ Brut [Champagne, France NV] 45 375ml

An elegant Champagne with aromas of flowers, apple, and candied fruit. On the palate the wine is full bodied with delicate fresh fruit.

Santa Julia, Tardio [Mendoza, Argentina 2006]

10/30 500ml

A beautiful example of Argentina's most widely planted white grape, Torrontes. Really pretty floral and honey flavors that are not cloyingly sweet.

Lillypilly, Noble Blend [Leeton, Australia 2006]

27 375ml

A mostly Semillion and Riesling blend, this dessert wine has flavors of lychee and passion fruit. Although sweet, there is a zesty, fresh finish. Great for cheeses.
